

It's not uncommon to believe God has it out for you. Life is sometimes hard...even brutal, and the notion that "someone up there" is against you is an easy place to land.

This may be because before Christ, Colossians tells us that we were enemies of God (1:21). But when you became a believer, putting your faith in Him, something changed. The God of the Bible reached down and granted salvation in you that no one could ever take away. (John 10:28-30) So if God has built this protection around us as His children, why then have it out for us?

We hope you'll be with us this Sunday as we explore this question further, and possibly even can dismiss this notion in your mind. John 3:16 assures you that if you're His, you are loved...even liked!
