

90 DAY PRAYER FOCUS

SAM

SEASONED ADULT MINISTRY



Approximately 200 of us have completed our 90-day Prayer Focus sessions led by Dr. Johnny Fain. Those who were able to attend the April 26 closing session in person were joined by Dr. Fain for some live Q&A time. For further study, each person who attended was given a copy of Anne Graham Lotz' book *The Daniel Prayer*. Johnny Fain, THANK YOU! Lives have no doubt been challenged and changed through your ministry. Now, what's next? We don't want this prayer focus to end!

First, at Bob's request, Dr. Fain compiled a list of books on prayer for your further study. These books will be in our FBCT Library after May 2. Also, the church is putting together a packaged set of DVD's and CD's of the videos and companion notes from our 90-day Prayer Focus. Any Book on the Awakening.
Good one to read about revival on campuses is "God on Campus" --Trent Sheppard. This is Glenn Sheppard's son. Incredible book. When people read about revival movements they see the working of the Holy Spirit through prayer.

Dr. Fain's weekly challenges:

Session 9. Continuing with the five areas of prayer.
Petition / supplication: Before you make your petition to God in prayer, ask yourself these questions: Why should I pray this request? Am I submitting to the Lord personally in my own life? Will this bring glory and honor to the

Lord? Does it hurt or help the Kingdom? Is this according to the will of God? Intercession: When you intercede for someone you are standing in his place. Ask yourself before your prayer, am I willing to count the cost to me for Him to answer this prayer? God calls us to intercede even at a cost to yourself (example: Jesus on the cross). In both our petitions and our intercessions, just keep trusting Him! Whatever His answer or even no answer.

Suggested resource: Put Off and Put On – 78 Things Not Accepted in Heaven by Bertha Smith

Session 10. How do I pray for others? People need our prayers! Get in the Spirit (the Holy Spirit) and ask Him what to pray; wait on God to answer back through the Holy Spirit; be careful to hear the voice of the Lord through the Spirit; the Lord will always direct you! Remember: Prayer is worship; it is the work of the Church; and it is warfare (a fight in the spiritual realm).

Session 11. How do I pray for the Lost? First, do you pray for the Lost? My prayer for you is that God will give you a burden for that Lost person. Remember, it's Heaven or Hell for eternity. Beg God for those who are Lost because eternity is at stake! Next, don't quit praying for that person(s), no matter how long, even to the end of your time here on earth.

Session 12. How to pray for yourself. You must! You are a child of God in Heaven! But how long has it been since you've had a freshness from God? Are you thirsty? Then pray for the Lord to give you a thirst for Him that will allow a revival of His Spirit to flow through you into every part of your life and the lives of those around you. I once heard "I once was blind but now I squint!" Spend time with Him and ask for fresh eyes to see the work of His Kingdom and fresh ears to hear His voice!

Session 13. What to do when nothing happens in prayer? WHY haven't our prayers been answered? WHY haven't I seen God do anything? God has reasons, and we have things that are hindering His answer. Remember, prayer is a spiritual journey, not a ritual, but a relationship. And it's all about HIM. Seek Him with all your heart, trust Him and wait on Him. Continue to meet Him. Watch and listen. The Holy Spirit will show you and guide you.



• HOW TO BE •

SAM with **KEN LASS** **SATIONAL!**

Now grant me wisdom and knowledge so that I may lead these people, for who can judge these great people of yours?
2 Chronicles 1:10

The other day I was reading a book about dinosaurs to my four-year-old grandson. At one point, he stopped me and said "Grampa, you sure know a lot about dinosaurs, were you alive when the dinosaurs were here?"

I wasn't sure whether to be flattered or insulted. Sometimes I do feel old enough to have existed with the dinosaurs, but I decided to play along. "Why yes" I replied, trying not to crack a smile. "I had one for a pet when I was a boy like you." Well, that turned out to be a mistake. He then proceeded to bombard me with one question after another. "What do they like to eat? Where do they sleep at night? Can you pet them? Do they eat off the trees?" You get the idea. I tried to make up a silly answer to each of his queries, but his thirst for knowledge about these prehistoric creatures seemed infinite.

I was struck by the realization that he was taking everything I said as absolute gospel and reality. It got me thinking. Maybe one of the upsides to being a seasoned adult is that you might have learned a thing or two during your life, and the young figure might actually trust you to tell them something that could have a profound influence on them. In Second Chronicles 1:10, Solomon is asking the Lord to help him use the road that God had him travel down to impart wisdom to those who are in his sphere of influence. The verse applies to each of us today, especially when it comes to leading people to a relationship with Jesus.

It dawned on me that if my grandson was open to believing what I told him about dinosaurs, he might also take to heart anything I told him about Jesus, about how God reveals himself in so many ways in this beautiful world, about how to be obedient, to have faith and trust, about how to accept Jesus as Lord and Savior. It's always a good idea to begin every day by asking God, just as the scripture suggests, to grant us wisdom and knowledge, and then grant us the opportunities to lead those whom we might influence. Keep that in mind the next time you are having a conversation with a friend, a grown child, or a young grandchild. It's a great way to be SAMsational for Jesus.

By the way, my pet dinosaur's name was Ralph, in case my grandson asks you. We need to get our story straight.

HIS UNFAILING WORD ... ISAIAH 40:8

Along with Mary the mother of Jesus, John the beloved stood by Jesus during His dying moments. The other disciples had fled; they were not there to watch. If they did watch, they did it from afar. Jesus had told them in the Upper Room after taking the Covenant meal "you will all fall away because it is written, I will strike down the Shepherd, and they will all fall away," but Peter said, "even though all may fall away, yet I will not." Peter did not understand his own weaknesses. In the garden of Gethsemane, Jesus simply said to the disciples "My soul is deeply grieved to the point of death; remain here and watch." Jesus returns from praying to find them sleeping and says, "could you not keep watch for one hour?" "Keep watching and praying that you may not come into temptation; the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak." The disciples could not keep watch; their flesh was weak. They were not there for Jesus' greatest hour. They would flee. Mark 14

"Without prayer, the armor of God will be of no value to stand against Satan's strategies." Voices in the Past
Jesus had overcome death and the grave. Transitioning for the "50 days" from Passover to Pentecost, Jesus had already been with the disciples for 40 days giving them further instructions about the kingdom of God when He gave them instructions to wait 10 more days. Pentecost means "fifty." He knew they needed one more thing which they didn't understand yet. Gathering them together, He commanded them not to leave Jerusalem, but wait for what the Father had promised, "for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." Wait 10 more days! Why?! "For you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth." Acts 1

Transforming grace had come! "When the day of Pentecost had come they were all together in one place." They had waited those 10 days. These all with one mind were continually devoting themselves to prayer, along with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus and His brothers. Such unity! (Acts 2) As Jesus promised, the Holy Spirit was poured out and permanently indwelt every believer as the Scriptures had foretold (Ezekiel 36:26-27). The Comforter would come alongside them as they shared the gospel of Jesus Christ of which they were eyewitnesses, convicting the world concerning sin, righteousness, and judgment. The mystery of the church would be revealed. Peter now the apostle would be the spokesman for this new hour, not of darkness but of new hope for his risen Savior had visited them, empowered them all to go and do His kingdom work. What a picture of God's transforming and empowering grace as they entered the New Covenant.

"Apart from Me, you can do nothing." John 15:5. We need His transforming grace moment by moment; we are His vessels. He does the work.
