# HOW TO BE SATIONAL! SALVE WITH KEN LASS

I noticed that our church recently conducted evaluations for another season of Upward Basketball. This winter I will have two grandchildren playing. Those kids have been in the program since they were four years old. Watching them play has brought us a great deal of joy and laughter.

If you ever want to see an example of pure, unobstructed human nature at work, go see the little kids play Upward basketball. Whoever gets the ball will inevitably take it all the way down the floor by himself and shoot it, despite the coach's pleas to pass it off to someone else. Much of the time they don't even bother to dribble the ball. They just run down the court and launch it toward the hoop.

Passing is no fun. Why give the ball to someone else? They're never going to give it back. They're just going to steal your opportunity to score. Why should they receive the excited applause from all the parents and grandparents in the bleachers? They get the glory, the acknowledgement. Not you. No sir. I have the ball and I'm taking the shot.

As the younger children finish their games, and the older kids take the court, it's fascinating to see the change in play. Now they are working hard to get open when they don't have the ball. And when they do get open, someone will actually pass the ball to them. They shoot and score and then light up with pride as the spectators cheer loudly. The delighted coach claps his hands and shouts praises to the passer, more so than the shooter. What happened here? What changed?

Well, what happened is that basketball, in its own unique way, has taught these kids the joy and fulfillment of doing for others. By giving the ball away and allowing someone else to get the glory, you have sacrificed your own personal gratification to bring happiness to another. That unselfishness will come back to reward you with praise from those who really matter, such as the coach. Don't underestimate the value of this lesson. That concept will stay with that child the rest of his life. He or she may not understand what they are learning at the moment, but they will know at some level that sharing their opportunities makes them feel good. It will give them a sense of what is right. In the crazy, self-centered world in which they will grow up, such awareness is not only valuable, it's mandatory for their spiritual survival.

Sadly, some people reach all the way through to the seasoned adult stage of their life without fully grasping that concept. Yet it holds true more urgently for us than ever. We have had a lifetime of experiences and acquaintances from which to draw opportunities to serve. Many of us are able to be retired and enjoy the free time required for such service. All around you there are opportunities to volunteer and to minister to the sick and less fortunate. Your efforts may or may not be acknowledged and appreciated by those whom you helped, but you can be sure the Great Coach in heaven will be clapping his hands and shouting "Well done!"

So go ahead. Pass the ball. Life is a team sport, no matter your age. It's the best way to make sure you are always in God's starting line-up.
