739 STUDENTS ATTEND FBCT D-NOW WEEKEND

On the weekend of January 12-14, we had 739 students attend DiscipleNow here at FBCT. Some traveled from as far as Florida to come be a part! When one of our Seasoned Adults sat up in the back of the balcony during one of the sessions, the comment was "it looked like a sea of students!"

Sean Curran led us in worship while Nate Hilgenkamp from Harris Creek Baptist Church spoke to our students. Nate focused his sermons on remembering who God is, what He has done, and who we are in Christ. The theme verse came from Psalm 77:11-12 which states, "I will remember the deeds of the Lord; yes, I will remember your miracles of long ago. I will consider all your works and meditate on all your mighty deeds."

On the last night of DiscipleNow, our students were given an opportunity to accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior. We had 32 students step forward making a decision. We had parent volunteers, Sunday School teachers, and college leaders meet with each of them to counsel them through what God was trying to say to them. On Sunday, we celebrated 21 students getting baptized rejoicing over that next step of obedience.

We are excited to continue to invest in the lives of our students. We are now creating Launch Groups where students will meet on Wednesday nights to read the Bible together and talk with leaders through what God is teaching them. We are praying that the Lord will continue to mature them into Godly young men and women.

But what a blessing to have the freedom to pursue hobbies, travel, engage in church activities and fellowship, chase grandkids, and then just collapse in the recliner and take a nap when you feel like it. It ain't so bad, this growing old. The only thing I'm struggling to get used to is that the mainstream world isn't marketing to us anymore. Our preferences and opinions are less important to decision makers. Businesses want the attention of young and middle-aged adults with young children. 

An excerpt from Sunday Matters by Paul Tripp. A book of 52 devotionals to prepare your heart for church.

"We therefore need the gathering of the community of faith for worship and instruction because it is so easy to become God-forgetful. I wish I could say that I look at everything through the lens of the presence and glory of God, but I don't. I still have moments when I fall into God amnesia, when I don't have my God-glasses on. And when I do this, life in this fallen world looks impossibly fearful. Very often my fear is really God-forgetfulness. I need again and again, by spoken word and worship—to have the eyes of my heart filled with the glory of my glorious Savior, Lord, friend, and King. I need this so that what I crave, what I think, what I decide, what I say, and what I do are shaped by the fear of rest and not the fear of dread. I love the gathering of the church for corporate worship because I need again and again to be awakened out of my God-forgetfulness, and I'm sure you need this too."





MINI WRITER'S CONFERENCE

The Mini Writer's Conference held on Monday, January 15 was a success and a good time! For those who were unable to attend, the following is a summary of what we covered.

"Nothing Happens Unless First We Dream"



With that theme opening the conference, we embarked on a half-day workshop on improving skills, being a positive voice to our readers, and continuing not just to inform but also to inspire. All, of course, to His Glory!

In our SAM Newsletter, we do this by incorporating the Four-Es.

- Every Issue . . . Glorify God and bring Him delight; tell the Gospel.
- Every Issue . . . Connect our SAM family.
- Every Issue . . . Inspire our SAM family.
- Every Issue . . . Inform/Keep our SAM family current.

The bulk of the conference was about how we can ensure that we continue to do that in the future by learning some basic skills that make us better writers. Not only for the newsletter but also for ourselves. Most people write for their own purposes. Be it self-expression, processing emotions, or part of our prayer journey.

We learned about the pervasive "Be Verb" and the importance of replacing those words with stronger words and avoiding the passive voice. We were reminded that a well-written, even-flowing theme is great but that the quest for perfection will still stymie progress. This culminated in a short writing drill where we were presented with a small cluster of seashells. Our task? Write whatever feelings were inspired by those shells. Oh yeah, we had 5 minutes for this little task, but you would have been amazed at the results. It was a great learning tool. No judgment and it was up to the individual whether to share his or her work.

Jennifer Rash, our keynote speaker and President and Editor-in-Chief of Tab Media Group (The Alabama Baptist/Baptist Paper) spoke on how we can act as a counterbalance to the negativity and cynicism of the 24hour media outlets. This led to an interesting conversation on what we can do as a group to give a voice to more people within our community.
