# HOW TO BE SATIONAL! SALVE WITH KEN LASS

It's never difficult for me to spot someone who is walking closely with God. There is just something about them. They draw people to them like some sort of spiritual magnet. You know people like this. There are several of them in our SAM fellowship.

In chapter 34 of the book of Exodus, we read about Moses ascending Mount Sinai, and disappearing into the holy cloud, where he meets with God and is given the stone tablets, upon which are written the law of the Old Testament. As Moses descends back out of the cloud to return to the Israelites, scripture describes his face as "glowing". My translation uses the word "radiant". In fact, his face was beaming so brightly that, at first, Aaron and all the other people were afraid to come near him. It was so noticeable, that after telling the people what God had instructed him to say, Moses had to put a veil on his face to calm people down.

There were more trips up the mountain into the cloud to encounter God. Each time, Moses would emerge with face glowing brilliantly. Each time the people were hesitant to approach him.

"But Moses called to them. So Aaron and all the leaders of the community came back to him, and he spoke to them. Afterward, all the Israelites came near him, and he gave them all the commands the Lord had given him on Mount Sinai." (Exodus 34: 31-32)

The glory and the influence of God was easy to spot on Moses, and I believe it is still true today. I see so many folks in our SAM group working very hard, devoting so much time and effort, praying so intensely, organizing, encouraging and facilitating our events and fellowships. They don't complain. To the contrary, they are always smiling, always ready with a warm greeting, always the first to volunteer when there is work to be done. They are.....glowing.

Anyone can see they have a rich prayer life. They communicate with God regularly, and, in His own unique way, He communicates back to them. Like Moses, they emerge from these encounters with a radiant outlook on life that is contagious to all around them. I don't have to tell you who they are. Indeed, they would be uncomfortable with any kind of public acknowledgement and praise, even though they deserve it. Yet I have no doubt you could sit down right now and make a list of several of our folks who fit that category. And if all of us were to compare our lists, I'm willing to bet the same names would be on all of them. It's no coincidence.

I've never felt worthy enough to "glow", but I'd like to get there. Maybe you would too. Guess what? There's hope for us. It's right there in second Corinthians.

"And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things, at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work." (2 Corinthians 9:8)

The weird thing about it is, those faithful Christians that are glowing? They're probably too humble to even realize it. Exodus tells us Moses didn't realize he was "radiant" until the people told him. God likes to operate like that sometimes.

Who knows? He may be lighting you up, and you don't even know it.


