"We can rewrite the Bible." THE Holy Bible. REALLY?!

There was a piece on FOX News Sunday June 18 where it was reported by one gentleman that it is possible, indeed perhaps likely, that in years to come the Bible will be rewritten by A.I. (artificial intelligence, or technology). He also asserted that it would be a "correct" bible. What does that mean? Food for thought.

It is incomprehensible to me that man would even presume to write a program for a machine that could possibly get close to all the unique nuances of the human heart, soul or mind that God created. Only God knows and understands those mysteries.

Our Bible is inspired by God and written under the power of the Holy Spirit into the hearts and minds, then hands of those writers He called. God's Word is His Holy Word; His alone. Has been for 2,000+ years and still is. Our generation and all those before us have relied on God's Holy Word in every aspect of life.

THE BIBLE POINTS TO JESUS

Only God could have put the Bible together. The Bible contains 66 books written over 1,600 years by 40 authors and it has one theme.

Having a single, unified theme is one of the reasons you can know that the Bible is God's Word. From Genesis to Revelation, the Bible is all about God redeeming humanity. Jesus is its star.

The fact that the Bible has only one theme is nothing short of a miracle. It would be one thing if the Bible had been written by just one person. The Koran was written by one person, Mohammed. The Analects of Confucius were written by Confucius. The writings of Buddha were written by Buddha. Because they were written by one person, you'd expect them to be uniform.

The Bible, on the other hand, was written by 40 different people—of different ages and stages of life—on three continents. And they all wrote the same story: Jesus' story. Prophets and poets, fishermen and kings, shepherds and scribes all had the same story. Some wrote in homes, others in prisons, and others on ships. You couldn't have put together a more diverse group of authors.

Yet the story is the same.

Imagine I gave 50 people each a piece of paper, and I told them to tear their pieces of paper into different shapes—but I never said how I was going to use them. What's the likelihood I'd be able to take those pieces of paper and make a map of the United States out of them? Those odds would be astronomically low. If I did that, most people would think it was a trick.

That's the miracle of how the Bible was put together.

We tend to think that the New Testament is about Jesus and the Old Testament is about Israel. But that's not true. The Bible says in Luke 24:27, "Beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, [Jesus] explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself" (NIV). When Jesus explained what the Scriptures said about him, those Scriptures were from the Old Testament. The New Testament wasn't even written yet!

The Bible's pictures, metaphors, analogies, and prophecies—from beginning to end—are about God's plan to redeem people and build a family for eternity. It all began with Jesus. You can see him in every book.

WELCOME HOME, GARY AND GWEN HOLLINGSWORTH

For those of you who do not know Gary and Gwen, let us introduce you. Gary was our FBCT Senior Pastor from 1996-2005, and now in retirement, they return to Trussville.

Gary was born in Anniston, AL and Gwen was born in Fayetteville, NC. Gwen's father was in the military at Fort Bragg. Gwen has a degree in Early Childhood Education from Jacksonville State and taught school for nearly 15 years in the early days of their marriage. Gary has a BS from Alabama, a Masters of Divinity from Southwestern Seminary, and a Doctor of Ministry from Southern Seminary.

"It was my joy and honor to serve as Senior Pastor at FBCT," Bro. Gary says. "I left in 2005 to become the Senior Director of Cultural Evangelism at the North American Mission Board. I then became Senior Pastor of Immanuel Baptist Church in Little Rock, Arkansas from 2007-2016. I was then called as the Executive Director, Treasurer of the South Carolina Baptist Convention where I retired in April of this year." Gary is now serving part time as his retirement ministry as an Ambassador for Mission Dignity, a ministry of Guidestone. This ministry helps provide financial assistance to pastors who were not able to prepare adequately for their retirement years. There are currently 2,800 recipients receiving assistance and they are living at or below the poverty level.

Gary and Gwen's retirement bucket list is "pretty simple" --- spend more time with family; travel (they are



currently planning a trip to Greece for a Steps of Paul land and cruise excursion). (Bro. Gary said they "have some spots open for anyone interested in joining us!"); and reconnecting at FBCT, which is also a big part of their plans even though the Guidestone ministry will take Gary to churches for speaking opportunities along the way.

Of course, their hobbies will get some of their retirement time. They both love yard work and walking, in addition to travel and spending time with family. Bro. Gary loves golf and reading (especially historic biographies); and Gwen loves flowers and doing special projects around the house, but mainly spending time with their two granddaughters who live in Hoover!

Now the big question one must ask someone who is returning to our State: Auburn or Alabama??? "There is no fence riding with the Hollingsworth's. We are Roll Tide Roll all the way!!"

WE NEED TO KNOW THIS

Governor Ivey signed into law on June 15 that makes it against the law to hold a cell phone in your hand while driving in Alabama. At this time, law enforcement will not pull you over for the violation, but if you are involved in an accident you can charged with the violation if you were holding the phone (in actual conversation or not). At this time it is still legal to use bluetooth to talk on the phone while driving. BOTTON LINE: Avoid distractions while driving.

National Voter Registration Day is September 19th, 2023. We have November 2023 elections coming up, as well as Primary elections, and then Presidential elections next year. BE VOTE READY! Find out how to register to vote; how to update or change your voter registration (have you moved, changed your name, etc. since the last time you voted); voting districts may change soon so confirm your voter registration status before elections begin; and check voter registration deadlines, including deadlines for absentee voting.

It's late morning on a Tuesday in Trussville. Sharon and I are sitting at a table next to the children's play area at McDonald's. We have brought two of our grandkids here to romp around. About every ten minutes they take a break from the play equipment to stop by the table and consume one or two Mcnuggets, then it's back to the action. Could be a long lunch.

Suddenly, my attention is drawn to the large window that looks out onto Chalkville Road. A long, white charter bus is passing by, heading for the I-59 ramp. Then, another identical bus follows. Then another. And another. Holy smokes! I start to count them as they go by. Six, seven, eight.....they just keep coming. Twelve in all. What's going on? Are we being invaded by the army? Has there been some sort of mass evacuation order that we missed?

The caravan caught the attention of everyone in the restaurant. I hear a man's voice behind me saying "Looks like the First Baptist kids are heading to camp." Ahhh, that's it. I remember now. Over six hundred kids, plus a small army of chaperones, were to leave today for camp in Tennessee. A week of fun and lots of spiritual training. It is one of the most important things our church does each year.

I am thankful that ours is a congregation that values the souls of our youth. I can't imagine what it must be like to be a teenager today. So many voices coming at you, espousing so many different points of view. Their world is very different from the one in which we grew up. It was easier for our parents to control our influences. There was no internet, no mobile phones. Shoot, we didn't even really know what a computer was. Today's kids have the whole world, good and bad, at their fingertips. What path will they choose? Whom will they select as their role models?

They need to see Christian leaders. They need to be told the difference between what culture says is acceptable, and what God says is acceptable. They need spiritual mentors. They need us!

What??? Yes, you heard right. Us! Crusty, old, out-of-touch us!

Granted, easier said than done. Personally, I don't have a clue how to start a conversation with one of today's teenagers. Seems like we would have absolutely nothing in common. But I'm willing to bet there is one thing that hasn't changed throughout the generations. When I was that age, the most important thing in the world to me was to fit in. To feel loved and accepted as part of something bigger than myself. No doubt that is still the case. If the body of Christ doesn't reach out and love and accept these kids, somebody else will. And that will be the direction they follow.

And if nobody reaches out to them? Let me share a scary statistic from the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention. According to a recent survey, twenty-two percent of all teenagers said they had thought seriously about suicide in the past year. That's more than one out of five. Eighteen percent made a suicide plan. Ten percent actually attempted to take their lives. It is the second leading cause of death for people between the ages of fourteen and eighteen.

My attention goes back to the play area, where I watch my two grandsons, aged six and five, frolicking on the slides and monkey bars, laughing and smiling, without a care in the world. What will become of them in this crazy, diverse culture? When they get to the point of having to make a moral decision, will they have had enough Christian influence in their lives to make a difference?

Maybe, instead of just shaking our heads in disapproval at the way today's teenagers wear their hair, or the way they dress, or the music they listen to, or their obsession with texting, or their awkwardness around adults, maybe we should try understanding them, try remembering how we struggled to find our identities at that age. Maybe we could even look for ways to assist our church leadership in ministering to our youth.

Helping to lead a young person to Jesus Christ. Now that's what I would call SAMsational!


