The great majority of fans will not even know your name, much less acknowledge your contribution.

You will have to be content knowing that you did your job well, and that you were an important part of the ultimate goal, which was to win the game. It could not have been done without you, even if most observers don't realize it. You're not jealous of the glamour players. You're happy for them. You feel good knowing you were a key part of their success.

Chapter 14, Verse 11 of the gospel of Luke embodies this spirit of humility and peace. Our Christian walk should be like that football player. Our mission while we have the privilege of walking this earth should be to go about our lives doing the things that minister to those in need and model the love of Jesus. Things that may never be publicly recognized and properly appreciated. A financial donation, a few hours each week of volunteer work, a greeting card, a phone call, or maybe just a smile and a warm hello. No one may notice. But you can have the security and joy of being assured that God is smiling at your humble effort to achieve the ultimate goal, to win souls to Him.

It can't be done without you. Why do you think they call him the "center"? Because the play doesn't work if he doesn't start it properly. He's the center of the operation. You are the center of God's plan to save the world.

Within the Church sometimes there is great confusion as to how I am to serve. The church was a mystery prior to Pentecost and sometimes we act as if it is still a mystery. But the mystery has been revealed. Yet you feel pulled in many directions or feel guilty that you are not doing enough. God has given us the course of action within each believer at salvation.

In Paul's teaching about gifts in the body of Christ is the clear understanding that gifts are limited. Paul lays it out clearly ... you have no say on what your spiritual gifting is ... your gift is a result of God's grace to you. "...there are a variety of gifts, but the same Spirit, there are varieties of ministries and the same Lord, there are varieties of effects but the same God who works all thing in all persons. But to each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good."

The Spirit gives you your gift,
The Lord gives you your ministry,
God will bring forth the results.

God has so composed the body just as He desired, so that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another.

Paul's word picture of the human body argues this powerfully. "For the body is not one member, but many. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be?" The design determines the limits.

It needs to be said that when a wonderful gift is given, the only one entitled is the divine giver. He is entitled to our honor, gratitude, and worship and our commitment to steward that gift well.

Being given a gift tells me about me in that I am not self sufficient but rather needy and dependent. It tells me I have no ability to do God's work without God's gifts. I can't take credit for my gift precisely because it is a gift. My giftedness doesn't point to me but to the One who has given it to me.

Ephesians 4:1-16, I Peter 4:10-11, Romans 12:1-8 and I Corinthians 12:4-31

Every believer needs to humbly assess not only where he is gifted but also where he is not.

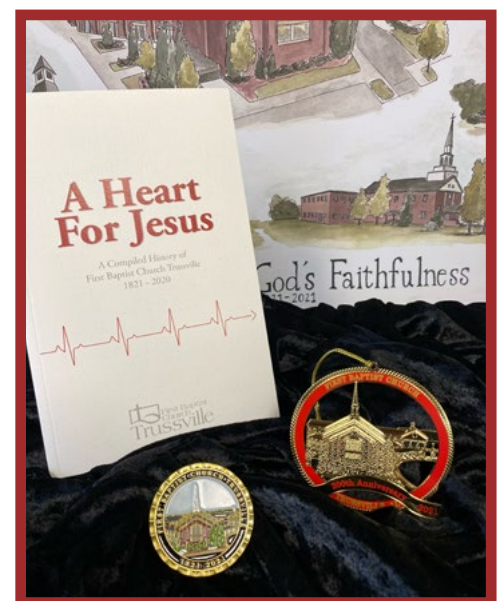

We still have a few Challenge Coins remaining – they were designed by Lance Pate, Jamie O'Dell and medal art by Custom Coins, LLC. You may be wondering what is a challenge coin used for? Challenge coins may be used for identification or to honor an achievement of another. They date all the way back to the Roman Empire. In 17th century France a challenge coin was issued to members of the protestant church to verify they were a part of the group and prevent infiltrators. They were used in World War I and World War II to identify military personnel as being part of a specific group. They are still sometimes used by the Presidents and members of Congress as identity verification and to show appreciation to someone for doing an outstanding job. We identify with our church and the challenge Buddy has given us as a church body to "COMMIT-KNOW-DO BECAUSE IT'S ALL ABOUT HIM". What a great way to congratulate a person recently led to Christ, someone who has achieved a goal in Sunday School, or many other things.

AN AMAZING SAM

The SAM organization of FBCT is incredibly diverse, but our members have one thing in common: the Fellowship of Believers. Since the coronavirus has interrupted our physical fellowship, and also since there are many members who are no longer mobile, we are using the SAM Newsletter to help maintain and strengthen the Fellowship. We are also remembering this is traditionally the time of harvest in our wonderful country. With all this in mind, we are renewing your acquaintance with a much-loved couple, Cecil and Charlotte Medders.

Cecil and Charlotte grew up together in the town of Alexandria, AL. They were childhood sweethearts, graduated from high school together and attended and graduated from Auburn University together. They married at the end of college and almost immediately Cecil was employed by Alabama Power.

They lived in Millbrook, AL, and were both active in Christ-serving opportunities. Charlotte had accepted Christ at a young age, and Cecil became a Christian while at Auburn. Their first of three sons was born in 1977, and from then on Charlotte was a homemaker. It was there in Millbrook in 1975 Cecil was ordained as a Deacon.

In 1980 the Medders moved to Trussville. The family immediately joined FBCT and became involved in church activities which included: R.A.'s, Youth programs admin, and Small Group participation. In 1983 Cecil was instrumental in organizing Men On Mission. He was one of the early advisors in the church parking challenge and the use of golf carts.

With all the spare time he had, Cecil developed a large, beautiful, very productive vegetable garden. There was a problem. There were not enough honey bees around to properly pollinate the garden. Because of this Cecil started raising his own bees and was assisted by retired minister Gene Ennis. Honey bees are one of God's most marvelous creations. Their use in pollinating plants and producing honey has been identified as long ago as 8000 years. In addition to being good to eat, honey is recognized as an antibiotic, various other medicinal remedies, and if properly stored will not deteriorate for centuries. Cecil can tell you all about the amazing bees. Starting in 2005 Cecil has been raising bees, having his garden pollinated, and harvesting and selling honey to us numerous appreciative customers. He and Charlotte continue to be recognized and loved as strong active members of SAM of FBCTrussville.
